Midway to the fiscal year 2014-2015, milestone achievements have been recorded once again in CPSC history. This issue shares with you dear readers some of our milestone activities covered within the quarter and some culminating activities that completed the midyear period.

Significantly breaking the previous midyear record in terms of number of programs and participation is this period's achieving more than 16.7% increase in participation (from 1,717 to 2,004) and 200% in the number of programs (from 7 to 23). CPSC Hosts Inter-Organizational Meeting with UNESCO-UNEVOC, HKIED AND CDETEP

n a rare and opportune time whereby prestigious international organizations meet to share common goals and aspirations with one another, CPSC spearheaded the gathering of top leaders from international organizations as it hosted the inter-organizational meeting among the College, UNESCO-UNEVOC, HongKong Institute of Education (HKIEd), and Pusat Pengembangan Dan Pemberdayaan Pendidik Dan Tenaga Kependidikan (CDETEP). The meeting was organized on December 11, 2014 at the CPSC Conference Room.

Dr. Mohammad Naim Yaakub, CPSC Director General, welcomed all the guests and led the discussions among top leaders of the inter-organizational meeting composed of Dr. Shyamal Majumdar, Head, UNESCO-UNEVOC and former CPSC Director General, Dr. Rupert Maclean, Director, Center for Lifelong Learning, Research and Development, HKIEd, and Dr. Mian Siahaan, Vice Director of CDETEP/Head of Program and Data Information Division.

The discussions revolved around upcoming programs, projects and latest global initiatives as well as lifelong learning programs of each international organization.

o contribute to the ongoing discussions on technical and vocational education and training (TVET) in the post-2015 development agenda, the Colombo Plan Staff College (CPSC) was among the intergovernmental organizations for TVET in the UNESCO-UNEVOC Global Forum on "Skills for Work and Life Post-2015" at the UN Campus, Bonn, Germany from October 14 to 16, 2014.

CPSC Director General Dr. Mohammad Naim Yaakub attended the forum which was organized by UNESCO UNEVOC with the support from the Federal Ministry of Education and Research (BMBF) and the Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ) and in collaboration with the Federal Institute for Vocational Education and Training (BIBB), GIZ, and German National Commission for UNESCO. It was successfully attended by about 200 delegates from UNESCO Member States, international and regional organizations,

n invitation of Chubu University through Dr. Hidetoshi Miyakawa, JICA Training Support Office, the Director General of the Colombo Plan Staff College (CPSC) Dr. Mohammad Naim Yaakub presented "The Initiatives in Education for Sustainable Development: TVET Perspective" during a side event of the UNESCO World Conference on Education for Sustainable Development (ESD) on November 11, 2014 at Nagoya, Japan.

The side event titled: Sustainable Human Resource Development for "Monozukuri", held at Room 131 of the Nagoya Congress Center organized by Chubu University, focused on initiatives in ESD from the perspective of various levels of education and industry. About 100 participants from several countries attended the event.

Dr. Naim's presentation emphasized that greening technical and vocational education and training (TVET) has a crucial role to

play in the development of new generation of individuals who could face the challenges for sustainable development-linking economic growth, social development and environmental protection. He reported some initiatives towards the adoption of clean and green technology particularly that of Malaysia and Korea.

The DG concluded that as far as ESD is concerned, the huge challenge lies with policy integration and intergenerational equity. Linkages and partnerships between organizations, industry leaders, governments and local leaders are necessary and for the results to be spread out to all sectors.

Apart from Dr. Naim, the event was addressed by prominent personalities and champions of ESD i.e. Yasuhiro Nakashima from the Japan Society of Technology Education, Izumocity Daini Junior High School; Ichiro Inasaki, Director of

CPSC DG Talks on ASEAN Economic Community's Impact to Education in Jakarta Conference

The CPSC Director General, Dr. Mohammad Naim Yaakub, was invited as speaker and panelist at the 5th International Accounting Conference and the 2nd Accounting Students Research Forum held at the Faculty of Economics and Business at the Universitas Indonesia in Jakarta last November 24, 2014. The conference, with the theme "The Accounting Profession Towards ASEAN Economic Community (AEC)", was organized by the International Accounting Conference and Student Forum (IACSF).

In his presentation the Director General centered his main points on Higher Education in the ASEAN countries in which he detailed the educational structure, framework and systems being implemented by the countries in the region. His presentation also outlined actions that are deemed necessary in achieving the desired goal in higher education among the ASEAN community. He also mentioned requirements to kickstart the ASEAN single market vis-a-vis latest issues and concerns concerning higher education.

The keynote speaker for the event was the President of the ASEAN Federation of Accountants—AFA, Ms. Estelita C. Aguirre where she elaborated about the influence of the upcoming AEC on the accountancy field.

Some of the speakers included Mr. Hatanto Reksodiputro, Former Secretary General of the Ministry of Trade of

Indonesia, who emphasized his country's support for the AEC. Dr. Megawati Santoso, Directorate General of Indonesian Higher Education, further contributed to the enrichment of knowledge by presenting the country's best practices in Higher Education vis-à-vis the future challenges and plans considering the implementation of the AEC.

Ms. Lucy Tjahjadi, CEO of Cargill, discussed the user expectations about accountant qualifications among the ASEAN countries and facilitated the sharing of experiences regarding accountant qualifications in different ASEAN countries.

The conference tackled several inter-country issues and facilitated the exchange of information especially in the field of accounting and finance.

CPSC **DG Attends ADB** International Forum on Skills Development in Asia and the Pacific

The event featured the results of the ADB policy research study on "Education and Skills for Inclusive Growth and Green Jobs" where leading experts on sustainable development shared their experiences and researches in tackling the trends on the creation of green jobs and green skills. It also tackled the regional policy research study on the responsiveness of skills development in some large Asian economies such as India, Indonesia, Sri Lanka and Vietnam.

The forum cited the importance of skills development policies in sustaining the robust economic growth of Asian economies while also taking into consideration environmental preservation. It also outlined the roles of education and training in ensuring that targets on sustainability in all aspects of the society and economy are met.

Several issues, such as the innovative approaches in skills development for the green economies, the futuristic perspectives and approaches in developing the green economy and the trends in the industrial sector that will have implications for education and talent development, were tackled in the forum.

Notable experts in the field of TVET participated in the forum including Dr. Rupert McLean (HKIEd, Team Leader of the project on Education and Skills for Inclusive Growth and Greening Economies, Green Growth, Green Jobs and Green Skills in Asia), Dr. Margarita Pavlova (TVET Specialist on Green Jobs, HKIEd) and Dr. Shyamal Majumdar (Head of Office, UNESCO-UNEVOC and Former CPSC Director General).

he Colombo Plan Staff College (CPSC) and Malaysia's Universiti Tun Hussein Onn Malaysia (UTHM), in giving life to a partnership through the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) signed in mutual view of working for a global quality educational progress, jointly conducted the Regional Program (RP) on Quality Assurance through International Accreditation.

The program was specifically designed to provide understanding on the quality assurance mechanism through accreditation system in TVET; and build the capacity of the 25 delegates from CPSC member countries to be certified APACC accreditors and eventually undertake an actual accreditation process using the APACC criteria.

The regional program, organized from November 4 to 5, 2014 in Johor, Malaysia, was officially declared open by the Vice-Chancellor of UTHM, Prof. Dato' Dr. Mohd Noh Bin Dalimin during the inaugural ceremonies held the first day. As he opened the program he welcomed all CPSC member country delegates and specially acknowledged them by each country. He conveyed his appreciation and delight in receiving all the country representatives in the university and for coming to the program. He shared with the participants and guests how the university is faced with challenges but with the full support and efforts of his team of faculty and administrative staff to him as their "pilot" the university is able to "fly" and answer to the Malaysian government's challenge of "spending less but performing well". In line with this, UTHM, he further added, is in concurrence with CPSC in advocating for guality TVET with TVET topping the list of the 10 "big ideas" in the global economy.

Plenary speakers and discussants delved on the issues, concerns and trends in technical education and skills development in the context of the following five major perspectives (1) Socio-economic (2) K to 12 and ASEAN Integration (3) Education governance (4) Entrepreneurship Education and (5) Global Environmental Challenges.

Key speakers representing the international cluster were mostly coming from CPSC with Faculty Consultants Dr. Hazrat Hussain highlighting the CPSC's accreditation and certification services through his presentation titled APACC for Accreditation and Certification of TVET Institutions in Asia Pacific Region; Dr. G. Kulanthaivel espousing quality technical education in India through his paper Quest for Quality Technical Education – Initiatives in India; and Dr. Zulkifli Zakaria sharing about Malaysia's education through his talk on Malaysia Education System: Pre-K and Beyond. Other key speakers from the international arena include Mr. Davy J. Goh, AUTODESK ASEAN Education Program Manager and Mr. Doug Nelson, Sales Manager, TestOut Asia Pacific and Africa. Also present was the Chief Executive Officer of TestOut, Utah Mr. Noel Vallejo.

Speakers coming from the national development cluster include: Atty. Teodoro Pascua, TESDA Deputy Director General, and CPSC Governing Board Chairman, who talked about TESDA's activities, Dr. Gaspar Gayona, Regional Director (Region 11), TESDA, who presented The Mindanao Situationer; Ms. Peachie Dioquino-Valera, Volunteer Climate Leader of the Climate Reality Leadership Corps., who forwarded advocacies on Climate Change Reality, Effects and Actions Needed Now; and Ms. Yvonne Flores, Intel Philippines, who shared about Intel Capacity Building Towards Digital Citizens. Atty. Pascua, shared updates on the major undertakings of TESDA to adequately meet the needs of the new breed of TVET graduates. He further said, calling out to TVET students, "skills is the next global currency...what we are doing is for you and all that will follow after you...nasa inyong mga kamay ang kinabukasan ng bansa (the future of this nation is in your hands)".

Col. Alejandro Escaño, Chairman and President of TEVSAPHIL in his welcome address, congratulated the people of the City of Davao for the progress fast happening in the city, for leading the way in disaster management and for always showing that Davao is truly proud of their rich culture---all due to the good governance by the Mayor of Davao City, Hon. Rodrigo Duterte.

Hon. Mayor Duterte on the other hand, through his representative City Councilor Mabel Acosta, congratulated the organizers for bringing the Congress to fruition. He

Image Building of TVET Featured in CPSC's ICP in Bhutan

t is a universal observation that impressions about Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET) are not uniform across economies, regions and communities. The common belief that TVET programs are usually stigmatized as "Second Class" in many developing countries, is rooted from the pre-industrial revolution and in the colonial past of countries', where training used to be and is being received by 'inferior' groups for blue-collar jobs. Vocational track programs therefore attract few students and its enrollment lags behind those in the general education.

The Colombo Plan Staff College (CPSC), realizing the implications of this trend, aims to introduce solutions to strengthen the image of TVET programs in the member countries, specifically in Bhutan. In view of this, an In-Country Program (ICP) for the Image Building of TVET was organized in cooperation with the Department of Human Resources (DHR), Ministry of Labor and Human Resources (MOHLR), Government of the Kingdom of Bhutan. The program was held at the NRDCL Hall in Thimphu from October 7-11, 2014. Twenty one (21) administrators and lecturers from Bhutan's TVET sector participated in the program.

The ICP aims to provide relevant insights, methods and strategies for improving the image of TVET. It also aims to address the challenge of inclusiveness of TVET by developing strategies for increasing access to TVET for the poor, marginalized and broader community of students. The program also seeks to promote and enhance relevance and quality of vocational skills for improved employability.

The program was supervised by the CPSC Director General, Dr. Mohammad Naim Yaakub and Mr. Sangay Dorji, Chief Program Officer of the Training and

Professional Services Division, DHR, MOHLR. Program coordination and expertise on the theme were provided by the CPSC Faculty Consultant, Dr. Hazrat Hussain while local coordination and logistics was provided by the Program Officer of the Department of Human Resources, Ministry of Labor and Human Resources, Mr. Kinley Gyeltshen.

The inaugural ceremonies were held on October 7, 2014, chaired by MOHLR Honorable Secretary Dasho Pema Wangda. He expressed his gratefulness to CPSC in organizing the program for the benefit of TVET in Bhutan and mentioned his appreciations to the current management of CPSC. On the occasion Mr. Sangay Dorji extended the vote of thanks to everyone involved in the preparation of this program and expressed his optimism on its success.

The delivery of the program followed a spiral learning approach, beginning with an overview of the core concepts, followed by progressively deeper application of the concepts and finally, a self-directed learning approach through action planning. Some of the program themes included: (1) Popularizing TVET: Status, Strategies and Mechanisms, (2) Models for Improving Access, Equity and Employability and (3) Gender

Mainstreaming Mechanisms in TVET. An action plan to popularize TVET was created by the participants to transform their lessons into concrete and executable plans.

A seminar which tackled current initiatives and practices in building TVET image in Bhutan was conducted on October 10, 2014. The seminar was designed to share emerging scenarios and trends related to local labor participation in skilled jobs and reorienting TVET to make it an established stream of educational pursuit by individuals. The broad themes of the seminar include: (1) National Human Resource Planning with Special Focus on Skilled Manpower; (2) Current Policies, Initiatives and practices in popularizing TVET in Bhutan; (3) Accreditation Frameworks for Building Stakeholders Confidence in TVET; and (4) Basic Techniques in Building TVET Corporate Image.

The seminar involved expertise of senior members from MOHLR including Mr. Kinga Wangdi and Mr. Karma Dorji, as well as a representative from the Loden Foundation (a Bhutanese nongovernmental organization), Mr. Pema Wangchuk, and Dr. Hussain.



CPSC's ICP in Thailand Focuses on **TVET Image Building Mechanism, Strategies**

n an effort to improve the impression of stakeholders on the Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET), the Colombo Plan Staff College and the Office of the Vocational Education Commission (OVEC), Government of Thailand, jointly organized an In-Country Program on "Image Building Mechanism and Strategies in TVET" held from November 24-28, 2014 in Det Udom Technical College, Ubon Ratchathani, Thailand.

Dr. Tanompong Panich from the Faculty of Business Administration, Rajamangala University of Technology Thanyaburi (RMUTT) shared his insights on the strategies in building a corporate image for TVET and how to maintain its identity and reputation.

institutional image can have a stronger impact in Thailand.

It provided timely opportunity to share knowledge and experiences on the status of image building and management in TVET institutions of Thailand, lessons learned and unresolved issues. The cross-fertilization and churning of ideas among academic and practitioner fraternity during the seminar would help in framing suitable recommendations for implementation by the TVET sector of Thailand resulting in the strengthened cooperation and increased satisfaction among stakeholders in the country.

n its continuous efforts to spearhead TVET development through the promotion of institutional excellence in its network of member countries, CPSC facilitated the conduct of the In-Country Program on Institutional Management in TVET at the University of Vocational Technology, (UNIVOTEC) Rathmalana Campus, Colombo, Sri Lanka from December 15-19, 2015. The program was organized through the efforts of the Department of Technical Education and Training (DTET). Thirtyeight (38) administrators and lecturers from the Colleges of Technology (CoTs), Technical Colleges (TCs) and DTET attended the program.

Institutional management is the process of laying out plans and organizing available resources to run a successful institute. The idea behind the institutional management is to lay out a strategic plan that outlines concrete steps to maximize institutional success with good quality assurance.

Succeeding the concluded onsite visit in the Dipolog School of Fisheries (DSF) at Olingan, Dipolog City, Zamboanga del Norte from November 12-13, 2014, members of the Mindanao TVET

MOU Signing between **CPSC, CDETEP** Opens Mutual Opportunities for Collaboration

n an opportune time during the Study Visit organized by CPSC for the Pusat Pengembangan Dan Pemberdayaan Pendidik Dan Tenaga Kependidikan (CDETEP), Medan, Indonesia, on December 9 – 12, 2014, the College seized the chance to build stronger partnership and cooperation with the latter for future endeavors on teacher education.

On December 12, 2014, CPSC signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with CDETEP which is valid for two years. - Create venues for the display of CPSC publications and other relevant TVET documents

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
- Workout collaborative programs related to TVET through the center, may it be training, seminar, conference or any other program of common interests and submit as part of the action plan on yearly basis
- Act as virtual centers for dissemination of CPSC selected programs as mutually agreed by the parties. CPSC's On-Course materials shall be made available through the CAPTVEC for consumption of stakeholders.
- Build stronger networks of CPSC Alumni in member countries who shall coordinate and support conduct of such programs in view of producing a multiplying effect for endorsing TVET staff training efforts of the member countries.

CAPTVEC is open for application to all interested institutions, organizations, universities and polytechnics in the member countries. Applicant institutions shall be assessed for the appropriateness of their resources and capabilities to be a CPSC satellite center apart from fulfilling other criteria set in establishing CAPTVEC. Some of the criteria for qualifying as CAPTVEC are the following:

Developing Ties

In view of continuing the Staff College's mandate of strengthening the ongoing north-south cooperation in technical and vocational education and training (TVET) that has become a priority of many countries now, the Director General of the Colombo Plan Staff College (CPSC) Dr. Mohammad Naim Yaakub met key personnel of the National Qualifications Authority (NQA) and Education Malaysia Office in the United Arab Emirates on October 19 & 20, 2014.

At NQA, Abu Dhabi on October 19, 2014, Dr. Naim had a discussion with the Director of Vocational Qualifications & Labor Market Strategies Mr. Khaled Al Obaidli and Expert in Higher Education Professor Ian P. Cumbus on CPSC and its accreditation arm, the Asia Pacific Accreditation and Certification Commission (APACC). The briefer video of APACC was shown by DG to provide an overview of the commission in a concise manner. He then further explained the process of application and benefits that could be derived when an institution is accredited by APACC. The meeting ended with a positive note as NQA looked at the possibility of engaging APACC as a mechanism to certify workforce from sending countries prior to working in UAE.

The discussion with Education Malaysia Officers including Mr. Shusilil Azam, Head of Education Malaysia Dubai; Mr. Mohd Azar AJ, Manager (Middle East/North Africa) and Marketing Manager Mr. Owais Mohamed Aslam Kazi in Dubai, UAE on October 20, 2014 focused on collaboration in bringing Malaysian educational experts to CPSC member countries to help develop their respective education system as well as the possibility of bringing students from CPSC member countries to Malaysia.

The parties hoped for continued communication to properly follow-up the discussions and decisions made during the meetings.

CPSC DIRECTOR GENERAL MEETS WITH UTHM ADMINISTRATORS, PLANS FOR JOINT PROGRAMS

High officials from the Colombo Plan Staff College (CPSC) and the Universiti Tunn Hussein Onn Malaysia (UTHM) held a planning meeting at the UTHM Satellite Office in Bangi, Malaysia on October 6, 2014 to discuss preparations for UTHM-CPSC Collaborative Regional Program on Quality Assurance through International Accreditation held at the UTHM Campus in Johor, Malaysia on November 3-4, 2014.

The meeting was attended by officials coming from CPSC were Dr. Mohammad Naim Yaakub, CPSC Director General and Dr. Zulkifli Zakaria, CPSC Short-Term Faculty Consultant; and from UTHM side were Dr. Jailani Bin Md. Yunos, Faculty of Technical and Vocational Education (FPTV), Associate Professor Major Engr. Dr. Mohamad Hisyam bin Mohd Hashim (former CPSC Short-Term Faculty Consultant) and Dr. Azman Hasan.

The meeting tackled several arrangements regarding the planned collaborative program including the provisions on the cost, accommodations and the overall program set-up.



he Asia-Pacific Accreditation and Certification Commission (APACC) welcomed six new members to the APACC pool of accreditors in the conclusion of the two-day international accreditors training held from October 14-15, 2014 at CPSC, Manila, Philippines.

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Established by the Colombo Plan Staff College (CPSC) in 2004, the APACC is an accreditation body that promotes the exchange and recognition of standard practices in TVET across the Asia Pacific Region. Its criteria and processes could be used in setting comprehensive quality management systems and its effective implementation in TVET institutions.

The accreditors' training was organized in order for the participants to understand accreditation as a tool for improving the quality of TVET institutions whereby an actual accreditation exercise is undertaken using APACC criteria.

Attendees of the international seminar include three members from various TVET organizations in the Philippines namely: (1) Ms. Sandy S. Montano, Corporate Secretary of the Technical and Vocational Schools of the Philippines (TEVSAPHIL) and Vice President for International Affairs, Community Health Education Emergency Rescue Services (CHEERS) and (2) Mr. Peter P. Negrido, Chief Operations Officer of the Private Sector Disaster Management Network (PSDMIN); (3) Mr. Marc B. Libo-on, Company President of PSDMIN and Operations Chief of Stout Con., Inc. In addition, two newly-appointed faculty members of the CPSC also participated in the program, namely, Dr. Zulkifli Zakaria, CPSC Short-Term Faculty Consultant from Malaysia and Dr. Govindarajan Kulanthaivel, CPSC Seconded Faculty Consultant from India. Upon successful participation and in fulfillment of the requirements the trainees will be taped for actual on-site APACC accreditation exercise in the future.

Furthermore, Engr. Md. Abdullah-Al-Mamun, Bangladeshi intern under the Professional Internship Program for International Experience (PIPIE) was also included as one of the participants.

The program was supervised and coordinated by Dr. Hazrat Hussain, CPSC Faculty Consultant and APACC Accreditor on behalf of the CPSC Director General, Dr. Mohammad Naim Yaakub who was on an official visit to Germany at the time of the program. Professional expertise was also provided by Dr. Romulita Alto, former CPSC Faculty Consultant and APACC Accreditor.

During the two-day activity, the participants were given a comprehensive discussion on the seven criteria that APACC uses for the evaluation of applicant institutions: (1) Governance and Management, (2) Teaching and Learning, (3) Faculty and Staff, (4) Research and Development, (5) Extension, Consultancy and Linkages, (6) Resources and (7) Support to Students. They were also briefed on the activities being done before, during and after the onsite visit to the accredited institution.

Furthermore, they were also briefed about the scoring system as well as their responsibilities and duties as APACC accreditors.

The closing ceremonies were graced by the Chairperson of TEVSAPHIL, Col. Alejandro Teves Escaño. In his speech, he emphasized that the quality of technical and vocational schools should never be compromised among anything and there should be a motivation to look for possibilities of improvement. He also expressed his gratitude to CPSC for conducting the program, citing the partnership to be mutually beneficial in addressing and promoting quality assurance for the long-term improvement of TVET in the Philippines and other countries in the region.

n another demonstration of excellence and quality advocacy's spread across all the regions in the Philippines, the Dipolog School of Fisheries (DSF) submitted to a two-day validation and accreditation exercise by the Asia-Pacific Accreditation and Certification Commission (APACC). APACC examined the institution's practices and standards in compliance with the accepted international benchmarks.

APACC Intensifies Quality Advocacy with Onsite Visit to Dipolog School of Fisheries, Philippines

The team composed of Dr. Hazrat Hussain (Team Leader), Dr. Theresita Atienza (team member) and Mr. Rae Emmanuel Echaveria (APACC Staff) visited the institution from November 12 to 13, 2014. The on-site visit was the second of its kind in the Zamboanga Peninsula region after the Kabasalan Institute of Technology (KIT), which was visited by APACC in 2011.

The Dipolog School of Fisheries, located in Brgy. Olingan, Dipolog City, Zamboanga del Norte was created when the Republic Act 2635 passed and approved by the defunct Congress of the Philippines on June 18, 1960. It was transferred to TESDA through the Special Provision No. 19 of the 1997 General Appropriation Act which provides for the phase out and transfer of secondary programs in TESDA Administered Schools of the Department of Education, Culture and Sports.

Currently, the institution is headed by the Vocational School Administrator, Mrs. Rosella Darcera. Its vision is to become a world-class fishery and allied sciences training institution and the provider of highly competitive skills and it plans to fulfill that mission by developing graduates with high competence and skills in fisheries and allied sciences through quality assured training programs and positive work values. The opening ceremonies, held on November 12, 2014, were attended by all DSF Faculty and Staff and graced by the Provincial Director of TESDA Zamboanga del Norte, Director Nilda C. Espiritusanto. She cited the relevance of this activity in fostering a culture of excellence in education among the Dipolognons. A presentation of the members and focal persons per APACC committee, as well as the schedule, were also held.

The accreditation team went around the competency areas and offices, particularly the food processing plant where they process their canned- herring and milkfish (bangus) for export to other places. They also observed institutional practices and workshops currently being held at the institution.

The institution was evaluated based on their self-study report covering seven areas namely: (1) Governance and Management; (2) Teaching and Learning; (3) Faculty and Staff; (4) Research and Development; (5) Extension, Consultancy and Linkages; (6) Resources and (7) Support to Students. Evidences in the form of documents, recordings, logs and other proof were presented by the institution.

Benefits awaiting institutions that may be designated as CAPTVEC include bigger networking opportunity with CPSC's international partners, wider access to current TVET trends and information, better opportunities in availing CPSC's Professional Internship for International Experience (PIPIE), vents for research paper publications through CPSC's STEPS (Scholarly Technical Education Publication Series), extended network with TVET institutions in the member country for operational level activities among many others.

CPSC solicits patronage from TVET institutions/ organizations of all member countries for this newest venture and encourages interested institutions to tender their applications for the center this early.

CAPTVEC is envisioned to further intensify shared efforts and partnerships with all stakeholders in setting directions for future programs, projects and TVET-related engagements in order to amplify beneficial impacts of CPSC's services on human resources development through TVET.



SKILLS FOR GREEN JOBS (featured on "TVET for a Green Economy" publication from GIZ")



GIZ, in its publication entitled "TVET for a green economy" identified that in order for TVET to play a significant and long-lasting role in the transformation of the economy and society towards a green, sustainable future, it will require a change in mindset and the possession of necessary skills that will encourage the creation of green initiatives and provide incentives to its potential participants. It specifically identified that the integration of sustainable development concept into TVET "cannot be reduced to individual vocational subjects or occupations", suggesting that a collective effort from the TVET providers and the government itself is much needed.

Supplementing the existing vocational skills with the core skills necessary for the development of the green TVET jobs are achieved through the following policy suggestions:

- Strategic and leadership skills to enable policy-makers and business executives to set the right incentives and create conditions conducive to cleaner production, cleaner transportation etc.
- Adaptability and transferability skills to enable workers to learn and apply the new technologies and processes required to green their jobs;
- Environmental awareness and willingness to learn about sustainable development;
- Coordination, management and business skills to facilitate holistic and interdisciplinary approaches incorporating economic, social and ecological objectives;
- Systems and risk analysis skills to assess, interpret and understand both the need for change and the measures required;
- Entrepreneurial skills to seize the opportunities of low-carbon technologies;
- Innovation skills to identify opportunities and create new strategies to respond to green
- challenges;
- Communication and negotiation skills to discuss conflicting interests in complex contexts;
- Marketing skills to promote greener products and services;
- Consulting skills to advise consumers about green solutions and to spread the use of green technologies; and
- Networking, IT and language skills to perform in global markets.
