The Board took up six agenda items as follows: Adoption of the Agenda, Adoption of the Minutes of the 101st GB Meeting held on June 23, 2016, Summary of Actions Taken based on Board Decisions and Business Arising, Report of External Audit of CPSC's Financial Statements for FY 2015 - 2016, Report of CPSC Activities and Financial Status (Mid-Year Report for FY 2016 - 2017), Report of the Standing Committee on various matters of the Staff College.

The Chairperson of the CPSC GB and Ambassador of Sri Lanka to the Philippines H.E. Aruni Ranaraja

presided the meeting. It was attended by the Chargé d' Affaires of the Embassy of People's Republic of Bangladesh, Chargé d' Affaires of the Embassy of the Republic of India, Chargé d' Affaires of the Embassy of the Republic of Union of Myanmar, Director General of CPSC, representatives from Embassies of Malaysia, Pakistan, Singapore, Sri Lanka and Thailand, and representatives from the Office of the United Nations and other International Organizations, Department of Foreign Affairs and Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA).

The new CPSC Director General Dr. Ramhari Lamichhane apprised the Board on the activities and accomplishments of the Staff College in the first half of FY 2016 – 2017 with the Mid-Year Report. He reported on the implementation of regional programs, in-country programs, customized programs and study visits, special collaborative programs, activities related to the Asia Pacific Accreditation and Certification Commission (APACC), as well as the Professional Internship Program for International Experience (PIPIE).

All the agenda items presented were disposed. In her concluding remarks, GB Chairperson H.E. Aruni Ranaraja expressed her appreciation to the Board of members for their cooperation and active participation.

# CPSC WELCOMES NEW MEMBER FOR BANGLADESH, H.E. ASAD ALAM SIAM

is Excellency Asad Alam Siam graduated from Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology in Architecture and did his MBA from Maastricht School of Management, the Netherlands. He joined Bangladesh Foreign Service in 1995.

Besides working in the Headquarters, in his early career, he served in South East Asia including Bangladesh Missions in Jakarta and Bangkok. In strengthening bilateral relations between Dhaka and the two ASEAN Capitals, his job included enhancement of trade and investment, cultural exchanges, and political coordination. He also covered UNESCAP and Asian Institute of Technology in Bangladesh mission in Bangkok and coordinated Bangladesh's entry to the ARF from the Mission.

He then served as Director in the Offices of the Foreign Secretary and Foreign Minister in the Headquarters between 2005 to 2007, managing coordination and consultation between these two Offices and rest of the Ministry, also with other Ministries.

He joined Bangladesh Assistant High Commission in Manchester, UK as Assistant High Commissioner (AHC) in 2006. His responsibility as AHC involved welfare of Bangladeshi

diaspora in Northern UK and Scotland and reporting regional political developments. From Manchester, he was transferred to Italy to open the Bangladesh Consulate General in Milan.

Returning to the headquarters in 2013, he headed the Department of Europe and EU coordinating bilateral relations between Bangladesh and Europe. Since 2013, he served as Chief of Protocol responsible for state ceremonies, ensuring privileges, immunities and security of foreign missions and international organizations in Bangladesh. He also coordinated Presidential and Prime Ministerial incoming and outgoing visits to and from Bangladesh until he joined Bangladesh Embassy in Manila.

In September, 2016 Bangladesh Government nominated him as Bangladesh Ambassador to the Philippines.

# NEPAL GATHERS EXPERTS OF NATIONAL VOCATIONAL **QUALIFICATION SYSTEMS IN THE REGION**

he Colombo Plan Staff College (CPSC) in partnership with the Council for Technical Education and Vocational Training (CTEVT)-Nepal and the Swiss Foundation for Technical Cooperation, gathered 22 participants at the International Program on Sharing and Learning on National Vocational Qualifications System (NVQS) held from March 6 to 10, 2017 at Mirabel Resort, Dhulikhel, Nepal.

Representatives from Bangladesh, Bhutan, Fiji, India, Malaysia, Maldives, Mongolia, Myanmar, Nepal, Pakistan, Philippines, Sri Lanka and Thailand participated in the program. Experts from Australia, Scotland, South Korea and Switzerland also came to share their experiences in implementing skill testing systems and qualification.

The program was organized to emphasize the need to have a common understanding in assessing qualification standards within the region. The international platform proved to be a venue for sharing of best practices in designing, implementing and monitoring a national qualification framework initiative. The international event had been relevant in assessing the significance and impact of qualification standards and mechanisms to TVET particularly in actually improving enrollment, retention and employability of the trainees.

The participants were expected to be aware of various approaches and innovations on NVQs implemented by the member countries in TVET. The program ensured that the learnings that they have gained such as the best practices and models of NVQs in TVET would be shared and disseminated in their own countries for them to learn from or replicate. In addition, the countries will be able to explore the challenges and opportunities in developing NVQs through the guidance of the invited experts and academics from the NVQS development sector.

The program also included field visits to several Nepali TVET institutions such as the Banepa Polytechnic Institute and the Training Institute on Technical Instruction (TITI) on March 10.




### National Seminar

Another highlight of the 5-day program was the National Seminar that brought together senior faculty members and experts to discuss country cases and examples of NVQS implementation. This event was held at the same venue from March 8-9, 2017 and was divided into five sessions.

The seminar's objectives were to: (1) Examine the issues and challenges in developing Qualifications Frameworks in the nation In-Country Programs al, regional and international levels, (2) Present tested models of conceptual frameworks and showcase different case studies, (3) Explore the challenges and opportunities in NVQs and (4) Exchange experiences and innovative practices in the development and implementation of National Qualifications Framework.

Some notable persons from CPSC's roster of past professional staff were invited to the seminar to impart their knowledge and expertise on the subject. Among them were Prof. Man-GonPark, Dr. first CPSC Director General currently Professor of IT Convergence Application Engineering at PuKyong National University, Busan, Korea; Prof. Pramod B. # CPSC In-Country Program in India Shared New Ideas on Instructional Design and Delivery Systems

he quality of teaching, learning, and evaluation in technical institutions needs improvement in order to enable the graduates from these institutions to acquire the competencies expected of them to survive in the competitive world. Structured instructional plans implemented in a systematic manner guarantee attainment of quality course outcomes. Teaching requires skills on building explanations, elaboration, communication, questioning, feedback, motivating skills, integration of media in teaching, learning and evaluation for effective implementation of the planned instruction.

In view of the need for enhanced teaching skills the Colombo Plan Staff College organized the In-Country Program on "Instructional Design and Delivery Systems" held from March 14-18, 2017 at the National Institute for Technical Teachers Training and Research (NITTTR) in Chandigarh, India. The program was participated by 38 instructors and TVET personnel from all over India.

The 5-day event was geared towards upgrading the technology skills of TVET instructors, shared the latest methods in instructional design, development, delivery, evaluation and management of educational and instructional programs which was delivered or supported by a variety of instructional technologies.

The papers presented during the program were: (1) Emerging Pedagogies and instructional processes, (2) Learning outcomes, (3) Instructional media and emerging technologies for teaching and learning; (4) Motivating Students and lastly, (5) Student evaluation.

Program supervision was handled by Dr. Ramhari Lamichhane, CPSC Director General while Dr. G. Kulanthaivel, CPSC Seconded Faculty Consultant, took charge of the resource materials and

CPSC arrangements. Local arrangements was coordinated by Dr. P.K Tulsi, Professor and Head of the Education & Educational Management Department at NITTTR, Chandigarh.

In addition, the program also tapped the expertise of Dr. Sunil Dutt from the Department of Education and Educational Management, NITTTR Chandigarh. CPSC also involved the expertise of Dr. M.M. Malhotra, former CPSC Faculty Consultant (1984-1987), Professor Emeritus and Former Principal of Technical Teachers Training Institute (TTTI) which is now known as the NITTTR Chandigarh.

Upon completion of the program, the participants perceived the course as very useful and was a great help to learn and experience the ideas, philosophies, and best practices of various academicians and experts, through the speakers and amongst themselves. The need to organize more programs like the ICP was realized as well, and various suggestions and feedback were provided through the OnCOURSE platform, deeming it very beneficial to the course.

The program design and management was rated positively by the participants, garnering scores of 95.63% and 96.99% respectively. The resource persons were received well also, with an average rating of 97%.

Pacific Accreditation and Certification Commission (APACC) in facilitating the rapid changes in the labor market in the region and its potential to contribute to the quality advocacy of Indian TVET polytechnics. He also added that APACC promotes the importance of quality assurance and molds the graduates and institutions to adopt regionally-accepted standards that will enable them to be accepted in any country across the region.

This year's conference revolved on three themes: The first theme was focused on improving the employability framework through SIIP which discussed curriculum development, skills enhancement, staff exchange, industrial projects, accreditation, survey and rankings. The second focused on tackling the ways to promote inclusive growth by enhancing alumni involvement, student's job placement, entrepreneurship and internship. The last theme collected the best practices and initiatives of the invited speakers representing their own institutions or organizations.

ive Nepalese officials of the National Skills Testing Board (NSTB) are in Manila from March 1 to April 28, 2017 for a 4-month long program on Enhancement of Competency Assessment and Certification Systems.

The Customized program was designed to provide exposure on and practical application of the Philippine National Vocational Qualification System (NVQS) methodology in order to reinforce the development of their TVET's assessment and certification systems and assist in improving the NVQS Project in Nepal.

The program is being organized by the College with the assistance of the Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA), Philippines. The program aims to provide the participants with knowledge on various systems and practices related

to competency enhancement and certification system.

Focusing efforts toward quality improvement and expansion of its services in Nepal, NSTB is currently in transition towards the establishment of the National Vocational Qualification Authority (NVQA) under an Act passed by the Nepal Parliament. This innovation centers on the enhancement of the existing system and development of the officials' performance. The officials have chosen the Philippines as a benchmark and training ground to beef up their expertise on qualification systems.

The objectives of the activity are the following: (1) describe the National Vocational and Qualification Framework system of the Philippines and its implementation mechanism; (2) explain competency standards development, competency assessment

tools development, assessment center management, results preparation and publication, and management of database related to competency (3) discuss assessment; how the **Philippines** conduct competency assessment and certification; and (4) prepare a Field Visit Report and Re-Entry Action Plan that will guide the institution in implementing vocational qualification framework in Nepal.

The program is being supervised by Dr. Ram Hari Lamichhane, CPSC Director General while program coordination is being handled by Dr. Romulita Alto, CPSC Faculty Consultant and who also acts as Resource Person.

# CPSC Hosts Nepal Officials' Study Visit to Manila on *Philippine* Apprenticeship System

en (10) officials of the Council for Technical Education and Vocational Training (CTEVT)-Enhance Skills for Sustainable and Rewarding Employment (ENSSURE) project of Nepal came to Manila for a Customized Program and Study Visit from January 30-February 3, 2017. The Colombo Plan Staff College (CPSC) facilitated arrangements for visits and exposure activities in various institutions and organizations to learn about and benchmark on the Philippine apprenticeship system.

The core concept of the project ENSSURE was designed in view of enhancing work-based learning mechanisms in Nepal which is quite new in the context of the country's industries and TVET providers. In order to strengthen the project's implementation, intricacies and challenges, observation visits were embarked at the initial stage of the project timeline so that appropriate learning and training of the implementing staff may be initiated.

The program was organized observe and assess the critical areas of apprenticeship training. It also aimed to equip the participants with knowledge to identify the methodologies of participants' selection, industries selection coordination and collaboration mechanism for the training. The visits were designed to enable them to observe and identify the tripartite work process (industry, implementing agency, and apprentices) in apprenticeship model. They were expected to learn from the experiences of the Philippines in conducting apprenticeship training and adapt best practices in the context of Nepal. Outputs expected from the group included exposure visit reports to share learning in broader concerned audience and action plans on how to implement observed practices to suit the Nepalese context.

The program was supervised by Dr. Ramhari Lamichhane, CPSC Director General, with coordination by Prof. Dr. G.

Kulanthaivel, CPSC Faculty Consultant. The delegation was led by Mr. Surya Prasad Gautam, Joint Secretary of the Ministry of Education (MoE), Nepal.

**ENSSURE** established under was bilateral agreement hetween the Government of Nepal and the Switzerland Government of the goal to assist Nepalese workers particularly from disadvantaged groups to benefit from continuous employment and an improved standard of living. The whole project, envisioned in three phases with 10-year duration (2016 - 2025), was implemented by the Project Implementation Unit (PIU) of the CTEVT with technical assistance from Project Support Unit (PSU) managed by HELVETAS Swiss Intercooperation Nepal. The project targeted to address issues of unemployment, underemployment and unfair pay facing the Nepali labor market resulting from the skills mismatch between industry demands versus TVET graduate skills.

Document inspections and interviews between APACC Team and SICAT Faculty and Staff APACC Accreditors during the tour of facilities

he Asia Pacific Accreditation and Certification Commission (APACC) returned to Santiago City for a 2-day reaccreditation visit at the Southern Isabela College of Arts and Trades (SICAT) from February 8 to 9, 2017.

The third on-site visit to SICAT was led by Prof. Dr. G. Kulanthaivel as APACC Team Leader. He was with Carlos Hilado Memorial State College (CHMSC) President Dr. Renato Sorolla as Team Member and Mr. Bryan Noel Lazaro, CPSC Executive Secretary as APACC Support Staff for SICAT visit.

The opening ceremony had Prof. Dr. G. Kulanthaivel and Dr. Sorolla delivered Special Remarks. Aside from the officials, faculty and staff of SICAT led by newly appointed Vocational School Superintendent Ms. Perla Lucas, DPA, TESDA Provincial Director of Isabela and concurrent TESDA Region 2 Officer-in-Charge Mr. Nestor C. Ave, Ph.D. was also present to grace the ceremony and provide support and guidance.

Local government representatives such as Hon. Benzi Tan Chai from the Local Government Unit (LGU) and industry partners led by SICAT Private Industries Development Association (SPIDA) President Robert Alonzo, were also in attendance during the opening rites of the visit.

The Southern Isabela College of Arts and Trades, located on SICAT Road in Calaocan, Santiago City, was established on June 18, 1964 as Santiago Vocational and Industrial School (SVIS) by virtue of Republic Act 3922. From its humble beginnings, SVIS became significantly relevant to a lot of communities of Cagayan Valley, which led to its transformation into a College through the Republic Act 8075. As part of the College's efforts towards continuous quality improvement and excellence, SICAT underwent the rigorous accreditation process of the Asia Pacific Accreditation and Certification Commission (APACC) and received Bronze award in 2008 and 2012.

Interviews, observations, validation of the Self-Study Report, tour of facilities and document inspections were undertaken in the re-assessment of SICAT's compliance with APACC standards. The activity revisited the institution's performance based on the 7 APACC criteria for measuring quality: (1) Governance and Management, (2) Teaching and Learning, (3) Faculty and Staff, (4) Research and Development, (5) Extension, Consultancy and Linkages, (6) Resources, and (7) Support to Students. Results of on-site visit activities are communicated accordingly upon deliberation of the APACC Board.

Manivannan, Principal of NPCP. During the welcome remarks, Dr. Manickam stated that it is a milestone for the polytechnic to be the first in India to undergo APACC accreditation. On the other hand,

Dr. G. Kulanthaivel expressed his gratitude to NPTC for pursuing the accreditation in his speech to the audience and he also shared that some institutions are starting to gain interest in applying for the APACC Accreditation in India.

Dr. Romulita Alto briefed the institution on the on-site visit schedule and activities. She also shared that the onsite visit is a new chapter of NPCP and she hoped that even after this activity, the polytechnic will continue to embrace and love accreditation as a way of life. Experts recommend cleaning out air conditioner filters once a month, either on your own or hire a professional. If they are covered in fuzz and dust, they can't cool the air as much.



# NO. 4: LOOK FOR LEAKS AND CRACKS IN HOME

Make sure your house is properly sealed in order to keep the cool air that you are paying for in. You can do this yourself by walking through your home and finding cracks and leaks in windows and baseboards, or you can pay a professional to come in and identify any leaks. Fill any holes with rubber or caulk. Do anythinag you can to fill these leaks and cracks. There's a huge debate out there [on the topic of green homes] of whether you should install solar panels, or just make your home an airtight box. Sealing your home will help you see a drastic reduction on your electric bill.



# NO. 5: USE POWER STRIPS

All of the gadgets you leave plugged in during the day, called the "phantom load", are increasing your utility bills. Use a power strip with about five to six different plugs and connecting gadgets in one strip. This way, you can either turn the entire strip off when you leave the house for the day, or find a "smart" model that only turns on when you want it to.




