We look back on the April to June 2019 as another busy yet productive period for CPSC as it implements various TVET programs to address different challenges that it has been facing in the region.

The last three months of fiscal year 2018-2019 saw the successful implementation of incountry programs in Bhutan, Nepal, Bangladesh and Sri Lanka on relevant TVET issues such as accreditation, youth employability, industry-institution linkages and technopreneurship, respectively. A total of 152 participants from these four countries directly benefitted from CPSC's expertise through interactive exercises and real-life exposure to practical cases through numerous industry visits. In addition, a national seminar related to these themes are organized in lieu in order to fully communicate the benefits of the training programs to more participants especially from the host institutions.

Notably, CPSC also spearheaded major regional programs in its headquarters in the Philippines, Singapore and China on Sustainable Skills and Employability, TVET Capacity Building and Green Economy, respectively. These programs are organized in cooperation with CPSC's relevant partners, in particular the Philippine Association of Colleges and Universities of Industrial Technology (PACUIT), Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MFA), Singapore and the Zhejiang Technical Institute of Economics (ZJITE); that have placed their continuous trust to our capability to bring together TEVT practitioners from 16 member countries to tackle common challenges in TVET. Overall, these programs brought together 50 TVET experts, instructors and administrators and has generated relevant networks and commitments to address the identified issues in a multisectoral approach.

We have also made efforts to go beyond our usual program offerings by organizing a customized program to members of the banking and finance industry in Nepal. In addition, we have also invited several Nepalese TVET teachers to develop their skills in developing qualification systems and competency standards for five weeks in Manila. We have also organized study visits to Bhutanese officials to Australia and Malaysia. These customized programs demonstrate CPSC's flexibility and expertise to bring together stakeholders to hone their expertise and link with relevant persons for the advancement of their respective organizational and personal development.

Due to the growing demand and increasing expectations of the member countries to CPSC, we have expanded our team of professionals by granting a faculty consultant post to a faculty from India, as well as young professional interns from Thailand and China. We have also organized several staff development programs in the form of practical training and workshops to ensure that our staff members will be more competent and capable of providing service to the organizations and also to you, our dear stakeholders.

Please feel free to browse through the pages of this quarterly to be fully informed of the different developments, activities and initiatives that CPSC has developed from April to June 2019.

It is through these efforts that we try to remain as transparent and committed to serve common interests for the development of TVET in the region. We continue to carry the torch of excellence in TVET that CPSC has proudly passed through different generations of TVET educators through the years.

GOVERNING BOARD HOLDS ITS 107TH SESSION, APPROVES CPSC O-PLAN AND BUDGET FOR FY2019-2020

The Chairperson of the CPSC GB / Ambassador of Bangladesh, H.E. Asad Alam Siam, called the meeting to order. It was attended by the Ambassadors of India, Myanmar, Pakistan, Papua New Guinea, Singapore and Sri Lanka; Director General of CPSC; representatives from the Embassies of Malaysia, Papua New Guinea and Sri Lanka; and representatives from the Office of the United Nations and other International Organizations, Department of Foreign Affairs and Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA).

The Board welcomed its new members from the Embassies of Papua New Guinea and Singapore, and from TESDA, before going through the agenda items. The session continued with the preliminary items and proceeded to first agenda i.e. the presentation of the Annual Report FY2018-2019. The Director General reported that CPSC made a number of milestones this fiscal year after getting the ISO 9001:2015

certification and being on track to achieve its targets on the Operational Plan.

Subsequently, the Chairperson invited the Vice Chairperson and the Director General to present the Report of the Standing Committee on the Operational Plan and Budget for FY 2019-2020. After the presentation, the Director General went on to provide the highlights of the meeting. Following the Board's approval on the Operational Plan and Budget, the meeting carried on to the Turnover Ceremony of the Chairpersonship and Vice Chairpersonship. The outgoing Chairperson, H.E. Mr Gerard Ho Wei Hong was appointed as Singapore's Ambassador to Manila by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs on March 18, 2019.

He obtained a Bachelor of Arts in History from the National University of Singapore in 1997. He subsequently obtained a Master of Arts Degree from Columbia University, New York, in 2009. He joined the Singapore Foreign Service in May 1997 as a Country Officer in the International Organizations Directorate. His first overseas posting was as First Secretary in Singapore's Permanent Mission to the United Nations from April 2000 to August 2003. He was subsequently appointed First Secretary (Political) in Singapore's High Commission to Kuala Lumpur from January 2004 to July 2007. Upon his return to Ministry Headquarters, he served as a Deputy Director in the International Organizations Directorate from August 2007 to August 2008, and then in the Southeast Asia Directorate from June 2009 to September 2009. He was later appointed as Deputy Chief of Mission in Singapore's Embassy in Jakarta from February 2010 to December 2014. Prior to taking up his current appointment, he served as Director-General of the ASEAN Directorate in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Singapore from January 2015 to February 2019.

Supervising the program is the CPSC Director General, Dr. Ramhari Lamichhane and facilitating the local coordination is one of CPSC's faculty consultants, Ms. Therese Tan Lee. CPSC's Officer for Research, Publications and Information, Mr. Rae Emmanuel Echaveria, also shared his knowledge on greening TVET as a resource person.

The program was opened on April 22, 2019 in an opening ceremony involving all the delegates and CPSC's faculty and staff. In his opening speech, Dr. Ramhari welcomed all the participants to Manila and recognized the relevance of the program in contributing to raising the awareness and relevance of green TVET in the member countries.

Classroom sessions focused on topics such as integrating green concepts in TVET Curricula, greening TVET through sustainable development and strengthening TVET for sustainability through greening practices. Study visits to facilities such as the UP Diliman Task Force on Solid Waste Management, Tuloy sa Don Bosco Alabang, TESDA Green Technology Center and TESDA Women's Center were embarked to further incorporate green TVET concepts with actual institutional practices.

The participants were also invited to participate in the 17th annual conference and 3rd international conference of the Philippine Association of Colleges and Universities of Industrial Technology (PACUIT). This year's conference was entitled "Leading the 21st century Generation Towards a Globalized Industrial Technology" and was held at the Ciudad Christia Resort in San Mateo, Rizal Province on April 24-25, 2019.

The event invited the Director General, Dr. Ramhari Lamichhane and CPSC Faculty Specialist, Mr. Abdul Ghani Rajput, to speak on topics regarding education for sustainability and industrial revolution 4.0. In addition, a panel on practices for green TVET on sustainable development was included in the program in which representatives from Fiji, Pakistan, Malaysia and Bhutan were able to discuss their country-specific cases on greening TVET to a wider audience.

Overall, the program demonstrated CPSC's expertise in its green TVET advocacy and reflected its long-standing partnership with PACUIT in strengthening opportunities for program collaboration.

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REGIONAL PROGRAM IN CHINA TRAINS TVET TEACHERS ON GREEN SKILLS AND NEW ECONOMY FOR SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT

Bhutanese TVET Officials Oriented by CPSC on the Role of Accreditation in Achieving Quality-Assured TVET Programs

hrough the years, the Royal Government of Bhutan has made considerable progress towards setting up of a modern TVET and recognized its significance as one of the strategies to facilitate socio-economic growth and accorded priority. Part of this plan is to upgrade the quality and capacity of TVET schools all over the country. For this year, it tapped the Colombo Plan Staff College to aid them in this endeavor.

From April 1 until April 5, 2019, a total of 30 trainers, managers, and TVET regulatory authorities from TTIs, as well as private training providers, relevant officials from the Ministry of Labor and Human Resources (MoLHR), and other pertinent stakeholders from Bhutan were trained by CPSC on the role of Accreditation in Achieving Quality-Assured TVET Programs. The training program was held at the premises of the Natural Resources Development Corporation Limited (NRDCL) in Thimphu.

The overall arrangements were jointly supervised by the CPSC Director General, Dr. Ramhari Lamichhane and the Director of the Technical Education-MoLHR, Mr. Norbu Wangchuk. CPSC's Faculty Specialist, Ms. Therese Tan Lee, was the overall program coordinator and primary resource person. She was supported by the Chief Program Officer for the TVET Professional Services Division of MoLHR, Mr. Sangay Dorji, who is also the local coordinator of the program. Discussions about the local context of accreditation was facilitated by the Chief Program Officer of the Quality Assurance Division at the Department of Occupational Standards- MoLHR, Ms. Yeshey Khandu.

The five-day event was a fruitful endeavor filled with activities and sessions that focused on the following themes: (1) QMS in TVET for Skilled Workforce; (2) Quality Assurance System on TVET Programs, Registration and Accreditation System; (3) Quality Assurance System on the National Assessment and Certification; (4) External Quality Assurance using APACC Criteria and lastly (5) Quality Assurance System of Bhutan. To complement the classroom activities, a study visit to the Royal Institute of Tourism and Hospitality (RITH) in Thimphu was also embarked to provide a more practical approach to fulfill the program's objectives.

The program was organized in collaboration with the Council of Technical Vocational Training (CTEVT).

The program was organized on the backdrop of Nepal's changing economic scenario and the reforms that are taking place in the world of work. More than ever, the collaboration and tuning between institute and industry are becoming recognized as an essential requirement to skilling youth for employability and for sustaining and promoting faster industrial and economic growth. Through this In-Country Program, CPSC contributed to the raising of awareness and provision of skills and values necessary to put Industry - Academia Linkages for TVET System into practice.

Dr. Ramhari Lamichhane, a former CTEVT member secretary and the present Director General of CPSC, was the program supervisor, along with Mr. Pushpa Raman Wagle, the present CTEVT member secretary. Dr. Rajesh Khambayat, the Joint Director of PSS Central Institute of Vocational Education (PSSCIVE), Bhopal, India, was the Program Coordinator and Resource Person. Meanwhile, Mr. Anoj Bhattarai, the Director of Technical Division of CTEVT, acted as the local coordinator and resource person for the program.

The program was inaugurated by Nepal's Education Secretary, Mr. Khaga Raj Dahal. He was able to meet with CTEVT officials and Dr. Lamichhane and were able to discuss emerging concerns in the field of TVET in Nepal.

In addition to classroom lectures, a national seminar and a study visit to a nearby industry was also embarked to expose the participants to practical examples on implementing measures to strengthen the skills of youth for employability. Relevant discussions regarding this matter were also tackled during the group activities.

CPSC Partners with Singapore for a 5-Day Joint Training Program

A total of 38 school participants, 16 are which from CPSC member countries, attended the Joint Training Program on "Technical Vocational Education and Training (TVET): The Singapore Experience" held from May 13-17, 2019 at the ITE Campus in Ang Mo Kio, Singapore. TVET instructors, administrators and representatives from Bangladesh, Bhutan, Fiji, Malaysia, Maldives, Myanmar, Nepal, Pakistan, Philippines, Sri Lanka and Thailand attended the program.

CPSC has been collaborating with Singapore's Ministry of Foreign Affairs through the Singapore Cooperation Program (SCP) and the ITE Education Services (ITEES) in administering this annual training program. Since 2008, it has benefited more than 200 TVET teachers and trainers in the region through the administration of more than 10 courses. CPSC facilitated the international travel of the participants to and from Singapore, as well as additional arrangements during the training program.

The objective of the course is to allow TVET professionals and leaders to gain insights into Singapore's policy frameworks and systems for TVET, including its experience in TVET administration and delivery, and explore holistic approaches in developing curriculum and pedagogy. Aside from the classroom lectures, the participants were also able to visit the Institute of Technical Education College West for a more hands-on experience to the facilities and training programs experienced by Singaporean TVET students.

Dr. Ramhari Lamicchane, the Director General of CPSC, supervised the program alongside Mr. Bruce Poh, Chief Executive Officer of ITE Education Services (ITEES) and Mr. William Tan, Director General of the Technical Cooperation Directorate in Singapore's Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

In-Country Program in Bangladesh Focuses on Developing Industry-Institution Linkages in TVET

n collaboration with the Directorate of Technical and Madrasah Education (DTE) of Bangladesh, the Colombo Plan Staff College (CPSC) successfully organized the Incountry Program on Industry-Institution Linkages (IIL) in the Technical Teacher's Training College in Dhaka from June 16-20, 2019. A total of 45 TVET practitioners, instructors and teachers participated in the program.

Through this program, CPSC contributed to the raising of awareness and provision of skills and values necessary to put industry-institution linkage system for TVET system into practice. It is founded on the premise that specific innovative approach is needed to deal with the industry-institution linkage developmental challenges for meeting the needs of today and in the future.

The program was supervised by the heads of the two collaborating organizations namely the Director General of CPSC, Dr. Ramhari Lamichhane and the Additional Secretary and Director General of DTE, Mr. Rawnak Mahmud. Dr. Vijay Patil, CPSC Seconded Faculty Consultant, served as the Program Coordinator and Resource Person. Engr. Md. Jahangir Alam, presently the Director of the Planning and Development Division of DTE and former CPSC Faculty Specialist served as a local coordinator of the program.

The program was opened on June 16, 2019 and was attended by Dr. Md. Morad Hossai Mollah, Chairman of the Bangladesh Technical Education Board and Mr. Md. Monjurul Kader, Director (Administration) of the Directorate of Technical; Education. Topics such as the (1) Concepts and Principles of Building Industry-Institution Linkages in TVET System; (2) Innovative Models and Approaches in TVET Industry-Institution Linkage; (3) Skills for Youth Employability and (4) Dual Training System: Concept, Benefits, and Challenges were tackled during the five-day duration. CPSC FACILITATES THE STUDY VISITS OF MOLHR, BHUTAN OFFICIALS IN AUSTRALIA AND MALAYSIA

The Colombo Plan Staff College (CPSC) facilitated a series of meetings and visits in Australia and Malaysia for the Ministry of Labour and Human Resources (MOLHR), Bhutan held from June 19-26, 2019. These activities were related to the efforts of the Government of Bhutan in uplifting the quality of technical and vocational education and training (TVET) in their country. A delegation composed of eight (8) high officials from MOLHR embarked on this trip to understand the implementation modalities of national diploma courses in TVET and process of program registration and accreditation in Australia and Malaysia.

Through the cooperation of various partners in Australia, the delegates were able to visit Crown Institute of Higher Education in Sydney, Canberra Institute of Technology (Bruce and Reid Campuses), Department of Education, Australian National University, Canberra Innovation Network, and TAFE Directors Australia.

On the other hand, institutions visited in Malaysia were the Department of Polytechnic and Community College Education (DPCCE), Ministry of Education, and the Department of Skills Development (DSD), Ministry of Human Resources in Putrajaya and the Politeknik Sultan Salahuddin Abdul Aziz Shah (PSA) in Shah Alam.

NEPALESE TVET OFFICIALS ATTEND A 5-WEEK CUSTOMIZED PROGRAM ON ENHANCING QUALIFICATION SYSTEMS AND COMPETENCY STANDARDS

Fifteen (15) officials from the National Skills Testing Board (NSTB) of Nepal is being hosted by Colombo Plan Staff College (CPSC) in Manila, Philippines from May 6, 2019 until June 7, 2019 for the immersion on the Philippine qualification systems, standards and processes. This is a part of a 13-week program that aims to develop an improved vocational training qualification and skills certification system in Nepal, with the remainder to be held in Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA) and in Kathmandu, Nepal until July 31, 2019.

The program is a supporting activity related to the development of a National Vocational Qualification Systems (NVQS) implemented by the Council of Technical Education and Vocational Training (CTEVT) of Nepal, with the financial and technical support from the Swiss Agency for Development Cooperation.

The program aims to describe to the participants the National Vocational and Qualification Framework and the integral subsystems of the Philippines and its implementation mechanisms. The lectures and lessons were designed to explain competency standards and competency assessment tools development. The lecturers are expected also to share their techniques on occupational mapping and vocational qualification package development; training arrangements and quality monitoring and reporting techniques in skill assessment. It is also intended to discuss how the Philippines conduct competency assessment and certification and share and guide on how to prepare Competency Standards Assessment Tools particularly the Evidence Plan-Project Observation and Assessment Tool Packages.

The program is being supervised by the CPSC Director General, Dr. Ramhari Lamichhane and Sec. Isidro Lapeña, the Director General of TESDA. Program coordination was facilitated by Ms. Therese Tan Lee, Faculty Specialist of the CPSC. Academic resources were provided by the members of the CPSC academic team namely: Dr. Romulita Alto, Visiting CPSC Faculty Consultant; Engr. Abdul Ghani Rajput and Mr. Sanyog Bhattarai, both CPSC Faculty Specialists; Dr. Vijay Patil, CPSC Seconded Faculty Consultant and Mr. Felix Sibal, ICT Officer.

The five-week training also includes several workshops and study visits to other institutions such as the TESDA units in Taguig, Metro Manila; Toyota Motors Philippines; Don Bosco Technical School-Makati; Hotel H20; Meralco Foundation, Inc. (MFI) and Lyceum of the Philippines University in Manila. An intensive immersion in TESDA will be the program's highlight in which they will be exposed to the practices of the agency when it comes to the development of competency standards and assessment tools.

In addition to the classroom lectures, the 5-day visit also included the exposure visits and study tours to different banking institutions in the Philippines: namely the Banking Association of the Philippines (BAP) and Asian Development Bank (ADB), The Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas Complex and the Department of Finance, Philippines. They were also able to see some of the city sights including Rizal Park, Intramuros, Visit to the Bankers Association of the Philippines (BAP)McKinley Hill and Greenhills Shopping Center.



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For the fourth time since 2008, the Concepcion Vocational School (CVS) in the province of Tarlac, Philippines, subjected itself to APACC accreditation to reaffirm the effectiveness of its quality practices. The tour of facilities followed immediately after the opening program. A series of interviews with different group of staff per respective criterion and documents inspection were then conducted to validate the claims stated in the Self Study Report. The 2-day on-site revisit concluded on June 25, 2019. The qualitative report including commendations, affirmations, and recommendations were presented by the Lead Accreditor, Dr. Romulita Alto, during the exit meeting.

GREEN HOME

The net-zero home

Net-zero homes that generate all the power they use are becoming more prevalent and more affordable. At the higher end are homes that use some of these techniques to create energy and lower their impact on the environment. Here are some features:

Passive solar design: Using south-facing windows to harvest the sun's warmth in winter and keep the house cooler in summer.

Insulated • wall panels

Site prep: All trees removed are chipped for mulch; all excavated materials screened and used for road base, backfill and topsoil. Construction debris sorted and recycled.

Concrete: Recycled cement with local coal ash and local demolition concrete

Geo-thermal heating and cooling system: A heat recovery ventilation system. Geothermal heat pumps use stable ground temperatures for home heating and cooling.

green home is a type of designed house to be environmentally sustainable. Green homes focus on the efficient use of "energy, water, and building materials". A green home may utilize sustainably sourced, environmentally friendly, and/or recycled building materials. It may include sustainable energy sources such as solar or geothermal, and be sited to take maximum advantage of natural features such as sunlight and tree cover to improve energy efficiency. There is no single standard about what makes a home green. However, as a general principle, it is easier for a home to be truly "green" if it is designed that way when it is built.

Solar thermal heating system: Evacuated tube solar collectors mounted on roof heat water used for in-floor radiant heating system in the home.

Solar electric power

> Stone: Locally quarried stone exterior

Gray water recovery: Water used in sinks, showers, washing machines is collected and used for toilet flushing and landscape irrigation.

Vertical farming is the practice of producing food and medicine in vertically stacked layers, vertically inclined surfaces and/ or integrated in other structures (such as in a skyscraper, used warehouse, or shipping container). The modern ideas of vertical farming use indoor farming techniques and controlled-environment agriculture (CEA) technology, where many environmental factors can be controlled. These facilities utilize artificial control of light, environmental control (humidity, temperature, gases...) and fertigation.

Plants at most vertical farms are grown hydroponically, or without soil, nourished instead by the recycling of a nutrient-rich water solution. Some such farms rely on aeroponics, where the water solution is misted onto the plants' roots. The farms are typically several stories tall, allowing for crops to be stacked in an enclosed space. Photosynthesis is brought about by artificial light, and sometimes augmented by natural light, like in a greenhouse.

Advantages and Disadvantages of Vertical Farming:

Vertical farming has a lot of promise and sounds like the farm of the future. However, there are a few stumbling blocks to consider before rushing full-speed ahead into vertical farming. This is indicated in the list below.
